

Wedge Heel Shoe

Fitting Guidelines & Care Instructions















Features

- Black nylon mesh upper
- Elevated forefoot to remove pressure
- Moulded thermoplastic rubber sole
- Secure hook and loop fastening
- Open toe and closed heel design
- Heel retaining strap to reduce shear

Indications

- Neuropathic Foot Ulcerations
- Post Surgical weight relief

- Material Content: Upper Mesh 100% Polyester, Foam 100% PU, Tricot 100% Polyester; Insole - 100% Polyethylene; Outsole - 100% TPR

Fitting Instructions

- 1. Unfasten the wide straps at the front of the shoe
- 2. Next unfasten the long ankle strap taking care not to pull it completely through the plastic loop.
- 3. Place your foot through the ankle strap and into the shoe
- 4. Ensure your heel is positioned firmly to the back of the shoe then tighten the ankle strap around your ankle
- 5. Firmly fasten the wide straps at the front of the shoe over your foot.

Walking Guidelines

- It is important not to allow any pressure on the front part of your foot.
- Step out with the affected foot first, putting pressure on the heel so that the foot does not roll forwards on to the toe area.
- Then bring the other foot to the same level (not beyond) and repeat.
- Taking your other foot further than your affected foot would allow rolling forwards on to the toe area creating pressure which should be avoided.

Handling Stairs

- When going upstairs, keep a firm grasp of the hand rail and step up with the affected foot first.
- Keep your weight on the heel area and do not allow the foot to roll forward on the toe area.
- Then lift your other foot up onto the same step (and not above), and repeat as you go upstairs.
- In the same way, when coming downstairs, always lead with the affected foot, keeping your weight over the heel area and always keep a firm grasp of the hand rail.

Care and Maintenance

- Wash periodically by hand with a damp cloth and mild soap
- Use a towel to absorb most of the dampness and then allow to dry at room temperature.
- Do not hang up, or iron and do not expose to direct heat sources such as stoves, heaters, radiators, direct sunlight etc
- Do not expose to alcohol, ointments or solvents.





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
